Content and Objectives

Overview: Saturday's working session will focus on three substantive areas: the epidemiology of HIV/AIDS and homelessness; housing status and HIV prevention; and housing as a factor in HIV treatment access and outcomes. During the morning session participating researchers will present and discuss completed research and funded ongoing studies. The afternoon discussion will cut across these topics to explore the policy implications of existing and proposed research, research gaps, recommendations for future data collection and analyses, and the effective use of research to inform public policy.

A Sunday morning working session will provide an opportunity to review Saturday's work and refine summit results. These results will then provide the basis for an afternoon public session that includes service providers, consumers, and funders of services and research. The public session will include a report out of summit results and products, community reaction to these results by a panel of discussants that includes NAHC Board members, service providers, advocates, and consumers of HIV/AIDS housing resources, and a roundtable discussion with current and past staff at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Products: The working group will be tasked to develop an outline for a white paper on housing status and HIV/AIDS prevention and care, and a proposed research plan for ongoing work. These products will be developed by the group on Saturday, summarized by SBPA that evening, and refined and further developed at the Sunday morning session. They will provide the basis for the report out and discussion at Sunday's public session, and will serve as the basis for the post-summit preparation of a white paper of summit results and a possible proposal for a journal special issue on housing and HIV/AIDS.
